# The Book of Galatians



“Justified by Faith”

Biblical justification refers to the theological concept within Christianity that signifies a believer's righteous standing before God.

It is the act of God declaring a person to be righteous and forgiven of sins based on faith in Jesus Christ.

## Biblical justification consists of several key components:

- Grace
- Faith
- Atonement
- Imputed Righteousness
- Redemption
- Reconciliation

1 O foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you that you should not obey the truth, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was clearly portrayed among you as crucified?

2 This only I want to learn from you: Did you receive the Spirit by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?

9 not of works, lest anyone should boast.


