
“The Purpose of the First Fruit Principle”

First Fruit

- ❑ Hebrew: The first part, the best or choice part.
- ❑ Greek: A beginning of sacrifice.
- ❑ Greek: The Promise to come.

Romans 11:16, AMP

Now if the first handful of dough offered as the first fruits is consecrated, so is the whole mass and if the root is consecrated, so are the branches.




The Jews were required to present such a portion of their harvest to God, as an expression of gratitude and of their sense of dependence.

Numbers 15:19-21, AMP

- 19 Then, when you eat of the food of the land, you shall set apart a portion for a gift to the Lord called a heave or taken-out offering.
- 20 You shall set apart a cake made of the first of your coarse meal as a gift [to the Lord]; as an offering set apart from the threshing floor, so shall you lift it out or heave it.
- 21 Of the first of your coarse meal you shall give to the Lord a portion for a gift throughout your generations.

Seven Things First Fruit Giving Produces

- 1) It Positions Us to Prosper—Location, Place, and Situation
- 2) It Guarantees Us a Planned Outcome —My Ending
- 3) It Gives Us Power to Overcome—Successfully Defeat Giants
- 4) It Poises Us to Wait—Prepares and Position Me to Do Something

Seven Things First Fruit Giving Produces

- 5) It Supports What God Has Said About My Destiny—
Supplies My Substance and Confidence
- 6) It Brings Fruit to Fruition (Maturity)—The Non-
existent Realm Becomes Real
- 7) It is The Blessing of Obedience


