1 And it came to pass, when the Lord was about to take up Elijah into heaven by a whirlwind, that Elijah went with Elisha from Gilgal.

2 Then Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here, please, for the Lord has sent me on to Bethel."

But Elisha said, "As the Lord lives, and as your soul lives, I will not leave you!"

So they went down to Bethel.

The Four Stops of Elijah:

Gilgal (Separation)

Bethel (House of God)

Jericho (Walk by Faith)

Jordan—(Death and Resurrection)

And so it was, when they had crossed over,
that Elijah said to Elisha, "Ask! What may I
do for you, before I am taken away from
you?" Elisha said, "Please let a double portion
of your spirit be upon me."
