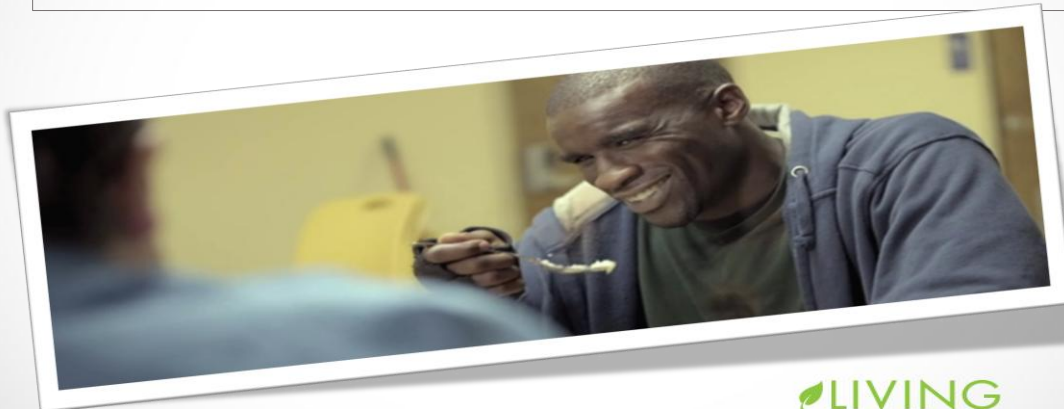
*It is possible to give away and become richer!

*And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death — even death on a cross!*
