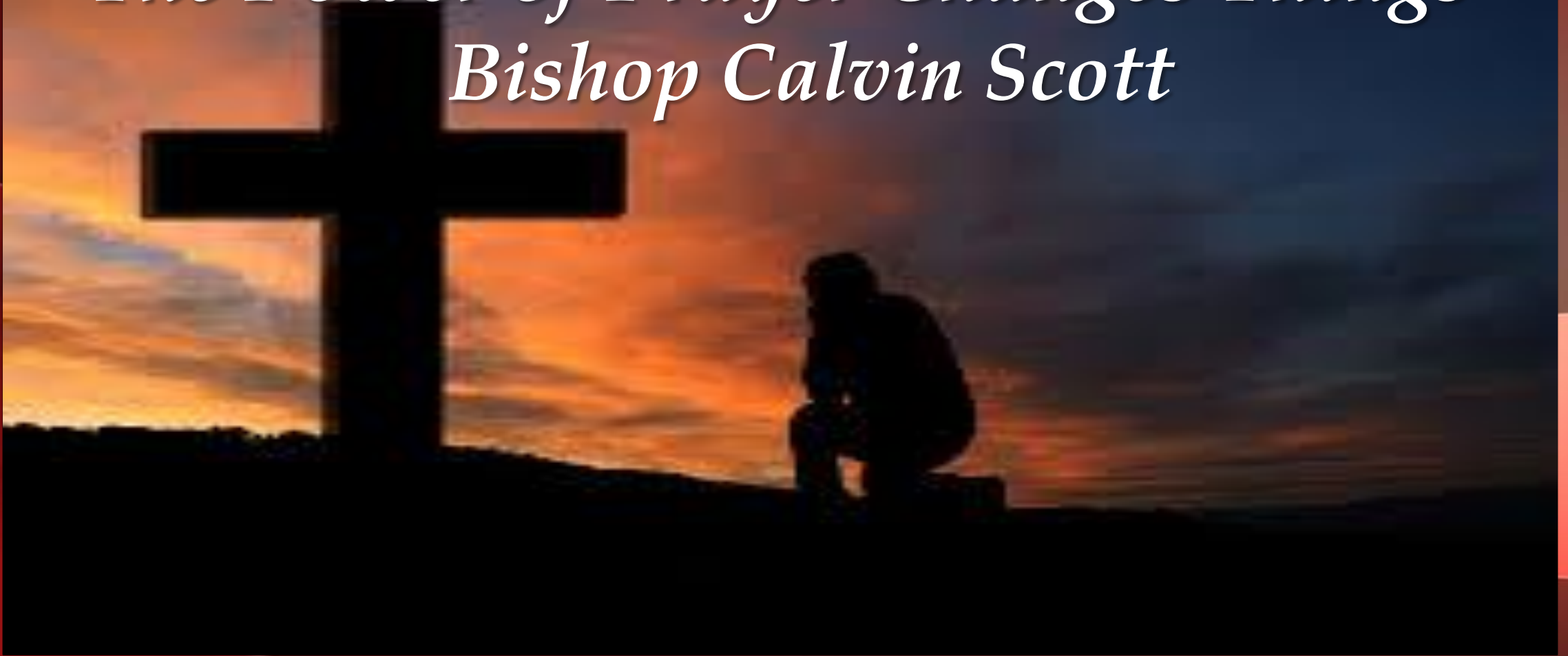


“The Power of Prayer Changes Things”

1 In those days Hezekiah was sick and near death.

*And Isaiah the prophet, the son of Amoz, went to him and
said to him,*

"Thus says the Lord:

Set your house in order, for you shall die, and not live.'"

*2 Then he turned his face toward the wall, and prayed to the
Lord, saying,*

3 *"Remember now, O Lord, I pray, how I have walked before You in truth and with a loyal heart, and have done what was good in Your sight."*

The First Law of Prayer

12 Therefore the children of Israel could not stand before their enemies, but turned their backs before their enemies, because they have become doomed to destruction.

The Fourth Law of Prayer

There is need for discipline, self-control and humility when prayer requests, intercessions, and petitions are made to God.
